Custom Jigs for Work



Napkin Rolling Jig

A woman with limited dexterity, range of motion, and visual impairments was hired to roll napkins. A jig was developed to help her locate where the cloth napkin should be placed. The dished out area allows the silverware to stack nicely and provides a rolling trough which makes it easier to roll and a more uniform end result.



One-Handed Bagging Jig

A man who had a stroke had only the use of one hand. This made it difficult to bag parts. A jig was developed which made it easier for him. The funnel is on a hinge and can be positioned upright. The tapered leading edge of the funnel allows him to slip a bag on it. When the funnel is down, a non slip surface beneath it keeps the bag from slipping. Funnels and tracks can be changed based on the bag and parts sizes. He counts the items, pulling them forward of the white ridge.
